

# "A Message From The Commander"

In 1919, The American Legion was founded on four pillars: Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, and Children & Youth. Each of these pillars encompasses a variety of programs. The American Legion, with the volunteer men and women who take the time to perform them, makes a difference in hundreds of thousands of lives each year on the local, state and national levels. A complete list of the numerous programs can be found at the National Website www.legion.org.

Due to both financial constraints and volunteer manpower limitations local posts cannot participate in all programs. However, in order to maintain "chartered" status, every local post is required to maintain a minimum of four recognized programs. We, Post 137, meet those requirements, and more, by participation in Veterans Affairs programs, support for our troops, Americanism programs, and many children and youth programs.

Finances for these program efforts come from membership dues (From all four of our affiliated Family Member groups, Legion, Auxiliary, Sons of Legion, and Legion Riders), a proportion of which is provided to Department of Florida and National Headquarters. Additional funds are received through donations and numerous fund raisers throughout the legion year.

Manpower to accomplish and/or oversee these programs is provided by <u>Volunteers</u>, some elected from the membership rolls and others appointed by elected officers. Additionally, volunteers are necessary periodically to supplement the core group of leadership. (i.e. Functions for children & youth by Chairman - 3rd Vice; Veterans services - 4th Vice).

# IT'S WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO!

We are allowed to operate, independent from Florida American Legion Post 137, a Post lounge for members and guests. Maintenance and expenses of our Post Home, including building and grounds and the Post lounge (canteen), is accomplished by volunteers and some paid employees. All expenses for these efforts are fully paid for from proceeds for services of the lounge or other fundraisers specifically for that purpose. No Legion funds mentioned above are used for this purpose.
